Sir:

Referring to the closing paragraph of your Office letter Education 63820-1906, dated July 27th, regarding the appointment of a mason at this school with qualifications of bricklayer, cement worker and plasterer, you are advised that Mr. H. B. Lamason who has been temporarily employed in this position and who had taken the required examination last spring was asked whether his name had been placed on the eligible register. He stated that he had not heard from his examination but would write at once, which he did. Not getting any reply he wrote again and today he is in receipt of a report from the Civil Service Commission, via Los Angeles, Cal., as shown by the postmarks upon the letter, that he had made an average percentage of 99 in the examination for brick mason. It is presumed that this qualifies Mr. Lamason for appointment to the position of mason at this school and if, when the names of eligibles are certified to your Office, his name is included in the number, I would be glad to have you consider him for appointment to the position.
