Sir:

Referring to your Office letter, Education 73064/1906, dated the 24th instant, there is inclosed herewith the resignation of Mr. Jesse C. Null as dairyman at this school. Mr. Null stated frankly that he thought he would be unable to do the work required of him in this position. From his limited stay here it was quite evident that he did not have any extended experience as a dairyman and could nor probably have met the requirements, even after a longer stay, considering his age and inexperience.

In this connection, it is the Superintendent's desire that the attention of your office be again invited to the employment of Mr. Norman Egolf. Mr. Egolf not only understands dairy work and the handling of milk, cream and butter making, but he is also a practical poultryman and understands butchering and the care of meats thoroughly, being at one time a butcher himself. All this work goes with the position of dairyman and it is very important that the same should be properly done by one who understands it. Mr. Egolf has during the past three or four weeks taken the non-educational examination for the position of poultryman, and he has also been notified that he has passed the dairyman examination and is eligible

for appointment therein. If his name is certified by the Civil Service Commission it is hoped that he will be selected for permanent appointment.
