Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter dated the 5th instant inclosing a letter dated the 2d instant from Murphy F. Tarby, formerly a student of this school, now at Easton Academy, Easton, Pa., in which he makes application for a position in the Indian Service. Complying with your request for a recommendation as to this young man's appointment and a statement as to the position we think him qualified to fill, you are advised that the young man's record as to conduct and industry at this school is good. During his term at Carlisle which was terminated about a year ago on his special request, he spent a large share of his time in the country under our outing system and his record in that connection is very good. He was discharged a year ago in order that he might enter Easton Academy and study for the ministry. He is not a very good student and, as you may judge from his letter and from others he has written your Office the last two years, he is somewhat eccentric. It is believed, however, he is honest and faithful and for any position involving work of a general nature and without any special training or qualifications we believe he would prove satisfactory. He is not quali-

fied to fill any position involving the trades nor would he be able to teach or to act as an assistant disciplinarian.
