Sir:-

I transmit herewith resignation dated the 6th inst. of Miss Sadie Newcomer as Teacher at this school, at \$720.00 per annum, such resignation being tendered to take effect December 21, 1906. Miss Newcomer severs her connection with the school and the service for the reason that she expects to be married during the coming holidays, and I would recommend that the resignation be accepted as tendered. In parting with Miss Newcomer the school and the service lose an efficient teacher and a faithful employe.

To fill the vacancy created by this resignation, it is respectfully recommended that Miss Cora B. Hawk be promoted from \$660.00 per annum to \$720.00 per annum, and that Miss Emma K. Hetrick be promoted from \$600.00 per annum to \$660.00 per annum, to take the place of Miss Hawk.


This will leave vacancy at \$600.00 per annum. Instead of filling this position by transfer or original appointment, it is my earnest wish and desire to promote Miss Anna Goyituey, who is at present receiving \$480.00 per annum to \$540.00 per annum. We have at present, no teacher's position paying \$540.00 per annum, and it is not deemed necessary or in the interest of the service to give Miss Goyituey \$10.00 more per month, or \$600.00 per annum.

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It is therefore recommended that the position of \$600.00 per annum vacated by promotion of Miss Hetrick be abolished, and also that the position at \$480.00 per annum now held by Miss Goyituey be abolished, and that in lieu of the two positions so abolished, two positions of teacher at \$540.00 per annum be established. It is further recommended that Miss Goyituey be promoted to one of the positions at \$540.00 per annum, and that the other position at \$540.00 per annum be filled by original appointment from the civil service register of eligibles, by a white woman. It is not deemed probable that an efficient and satisfactory white teacher can be procured at a less salary than \$540.00. The new teacher should be appointed and report here for duty not later than January 1st next, and all the changes above recommended can be effected at that date if so desired. These changes will involve no increase in total of salaries. While I recommend the above changes somewhat reluctantly in the midst of the school year, the same are made in the interest of more efficient service, and I sincerely hope that they will be approved by your office and the department.
