

Sir:

Referring to your letter (Education 98204/1906), dated Nov. 12, 1906, I have to say that after all we find it impossible to get a suitable woman from Carlisle to fill the position of hospital cook. We have, however, an Alaskan girl, whose time at the school will be out shortly, who is an excellent girl for the position and has had some experience there temporarily as a student and will give good satisfaction to the physician in charge and to the nurse, and I have this day nominated her for appointment temporarily to the position of hospital cook. I desire, if possible, that your Office take no further action looking to the employment of a white cook for the present at least. The intention is to keep the Alaskan girl, Marie McCloud, on that duty until she goes home in June next.
