Corrections in the transmission of messages to any point on the lines of the Company can be inserted by continuing the message, setting agreed amount of risk, and payment of amount of repeating thereon, at the following rates, in addition to the rate for the original message: for messages sent by day, one cent per cent per any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles; for messages sent by night, one cent per cent per any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles.

No responsibility regarding messages attaches to the Company until they are presented and accepted at one of its main transmitting offices; and if a message is sent to such office, it is the responsibility of the sender to act by the rules of the office as the agent of the sender.

Messengers will be delivered free within the established free-delivery limits of the terminal office. For delivery outside these limits a special charge will be made to cover the expense of such delivery. For

This Company will not be liable for damages or statutory damages in any case where the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the date of the message, and in which the Company for transmission

This is a non-repudiated message and its delivery by the Company for transmission above the limits of the terminal office is not guaranteed against delay or non-delivery, and its transmission is subject to the same conditions as those set forth above. The sender agrees to indemnify the Company against all claims for damages or compensation.
