Sir:

Answering your Office letter (Education 7092/07) dated the 25th ultimo, by the Chief Clerk, asking to be advised whether we can recommend a graduate of this school for the position of disciplinarian at \$420 per annum at the Rainy Mountain School, Okla., you are advised that we know of no graduate or ex-student at present unemployed who would be likely to accept the position. There are however, young men now at the school, undergraduates, who would, I think, be fully competent to fill the position. I would recommend either Jackson Saunooke, a member of the Eastern Cherokee tribe, North Carolina, or John Godfrey, of the Miami tribe from Fort Wayne, Indiana. Saunooke has been in this school since Sept. 17, 1899, and is a full-blood. Godfrey has only been at the school since April 1, 1906, and is of  $\frac{1}{4}$  Indian blood. Neither one is a musician and could not therefore be of any help to the band. Of the two, perhaps Saunooke, on account of his more extended training, would be the more efficient.
