In lieu of receipt there is enclosed herewith cancelled check No. 3314, Carlisle Deposit Bank, dated Nov. 28, 1906, for \$28.00 "to close account" of Fred Battenberg. We were unable to procure his receipt, and it is thought that there would be no prospect of getting same as his whereabouts are unknown.

There are also enclosed receipts for disbursements made from the emergency account as follows:

A few other charges have also been made against the emergency account for which we have not yet been able to obtain receipts. There is also charged against the account, the over-drawn accounts of pupils amounting to \$756.45. With the exception of the

runaways, who we will not be able to reach, it is expected that most of the over-drafts will be collected and made good, and as fast as collected, they will be credited to the emergency account. A considerable sum has already been collected since the first of January. There has also been charged to the emergency account the over-draft on account of Umbrellas purchased and issued to Indians amounting to \$320.50.

There also remain a limited number of receipts for individual pupils accounts, which we have thus far been unable to procure. Every effort is being made to obtain the same, and as soon as they are procured, they will be forwarded.
