Sir:-

Referring to Office letter, Education 26094/1907, dated the 18th instant, by the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs, I have hereby to confirm telegram sent you this morning in regard to transfer of Miss Newman to Southern Ute School, Colorado, as seamstress, the telegram reading as follows:-

"Miss Newman declines transfer to Southern Ute School, account distance. Would like position nearer Carlisle".

In connection with the foregoing, I enclose herewith a note from Miss Newman which will explain itself. She would be glad to accept transfer appointment to some position as seamstress at some school not farther from Carlisle than Wisconsin or Minnesota.
