Sir:-

Your Office letter, Education 26241/1907, dated the 19th instant, from the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs, enclosing letter dated the 12th instant from Supervisor in Charge, Charles H. Dickson, of the Chamberlain Indian School, S.D., in regard to the enrollment of Wallace Tyndall as a pupil, is at hand.

Complying with the request for recommendation as to the enrollment of this boy, I regret to be obliged to report that his conduct as a pupil at Carlisle was very bad, and that, in my opinion, the proper place for him is in a Reformatory. The boy is a member of the Omaha Tribe and was enrolled here on May 12, 1905, at the age of eleven years. He was expelled on January 15, 1907, and his expulsion was approved by your Office. In view of his record here, I cannot recommend his enrollment at any other Government Indian School, but whether or not the fact that his father is disciplinarian of the Chamberlain School, where application is made to enroll the boy, should make a difference, it is left for your Office and the Superintendent at Chamberlain to determine.

Supervisor Dickson's letter is herewith returned.
