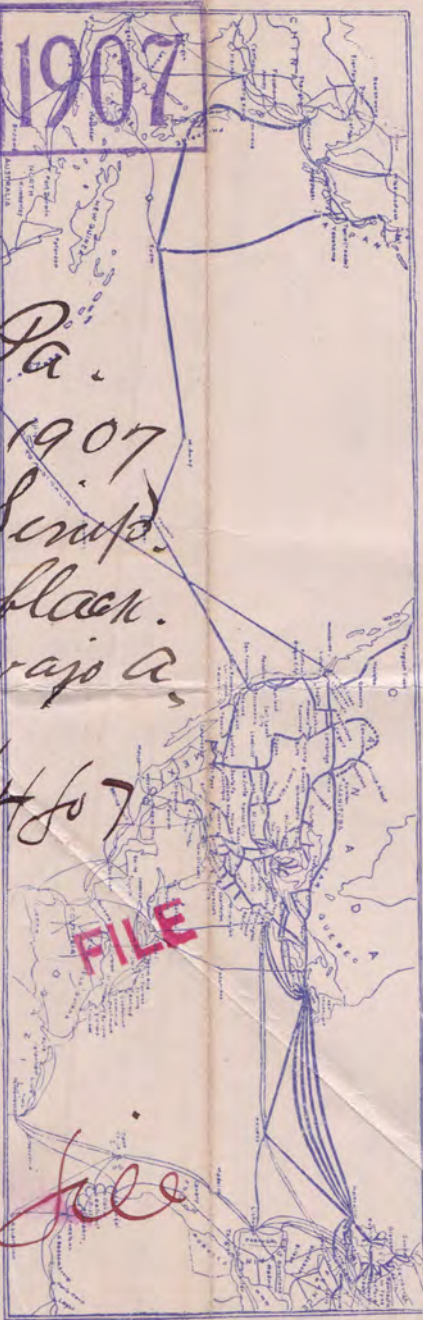

And this Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, with full authority to accept and forward messages on the lines of any other Company, if necessary in respect of destination or transmission, and to make such changes or repairs as may be necessary in routes or stations agreed, amount of risk, and payment of greater distance.

No responsibility regarding messages attached to the Company's lines, or presented and accepted at one of its transmitting offices; and if a message is sent to such office by one of the Company's agents, the sender shall be responsible for the same.
