

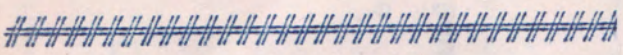

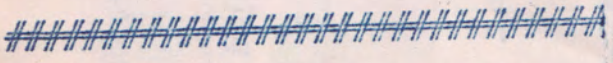

Sir:--

Referring to Office letter, Education 35304/1907, dated the 13th instant, by the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs, in regard to the appointment of John Godfrey, a pupil of this school, as disciplinarian at Pipestone, Minn., there is enclosed herewith a copy of letter dated April 8, 1907, from the Superintendent of said school. It will be noted that the Superintendent was anxious to have Godfrey report not later than April 15th, and feeling that there was no doubt the position would be vacant at that time, and the appointment had been authorized by your Office, the young man left here for Pipestone on Friday, the 12th instant.

He was willing to assume the duties of the position at the reduced salary, \$600.00 instead of \$720.00.

Dear Sir:-

I have just received a letter from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs relative to the appointment of John Godfrey, upon your recommendation, as Disciplinarian at this school, in which he states that there would be no objection to this, but says further that the Office is of the opinion that he should be started in at a lower salary, and that if he meets the requirements of the position, and is found worthy, it can be increased. I have replied to this letter recommending that it be made \$600.00 per annum to start with, but I am confident that if he fills the bill it will soon be raised again to \$720.00. If Mr. Godfrey is willing to come under these conditions you will please have him report here for duty by not later than the 15th instant.
