

Sir:-

We are in receipt of your Office letter dated the 16th instant (Education 45840/1907) from the Chief Clerk, asking for a statement as to the general fitness of William G. Isham of Hayward, Wisconsin, for the position of disciplinarian in the Indian Service, for which he has applied.

In reply, I have to state that this young man was a student at Carlisle for a period of about three years and was discharged a year ago last December for cause which, however, we feel should not now be held against him. He is, we believe, well fitted and equipped for the duties of disciplinarian and would, we think, prove satisfactory in such a position. He is, on the whole, a young man of good habits, steady and industrious. He is a member of the Chippewa tribe, and according to our records is now about twenty-five years of age. We would be glad to have him receive an appointment as disciplinarian in one of the small schools.
