

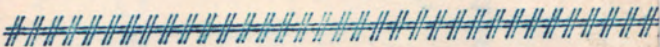



Sir:-

Replying to your Office letter, Education, 49055/1907, I am sorry to report that there is no Indian here who has had clerical experience, or otherwise would qualify for the position of clerk at \$600 per annum at the Cantonment Agency, Oklahoma. This is a desirable opening for our students, and another year, I expect to be in a position to take advantage of any such opportunities, as I shall especially instruct two or three boys who are suitably equipped for clerical work. That is a line of instruction which has never received any attention here, and I believe it should be given a place among our industries to the great advantage of a number of boys who wish to take up that line of work.
