Sir:-

We have a pupil at the school, an Omaha Indian girl, Margaret Fremont, who has been here a number of years, and who is very proficient as a seamstress. Her teacher reports her as being able to sew beautifully, and she understands cutting and fitting also, and that she is of good character, fine disposition; and I recommend her for a position in the Indian Service as seamstress at a small school, or assistant seamstress at a larger one. I am sure she will be a very efficient employee, and there is absolutely nothing for her at home on the Omaha reservation. She is twenty-four years of age.

Please place her name on file and give it early consideration, and if you can give me any encouragement for a place in the near future, I shall be glad to have it.

Referring to your recommendation of Margaret Fremont, an Omaha pupil, for appointment as seamstress, you are informed that there is a vacancy as assistant seamstress at \$360 per annum at the Rainy Mountain school, Oklahoma, and if Miss Fremont wishes to try the examination it may be possible to give her the position. The U.S. Indian Agent in charge of the school has today been communicated with, and if he has not already taken steps to procure an Indian, Miss Fremont will be appointed after she passes the examination. In the meanwhile, however, the Office would like to know whether she cares to try the examination.
