Sir:-

Referring to letter dated the 21st. instant requesting facts and circumstances in connection with voucher of Fred W. Canfield, I beg to state that the boys named therein were brought back to the school for desertion and general disregard of school rules and outing system, the same being detrimental to the proper discipline of the school.

Mitchell LaFleur was placed in the hands of a Justice of Peace at Doylestown, Pa., for attacking his patron and the subsequent fine was paid by Mr. Canfield as shown by sub voucher A1. In most cases the expenses so incurred are generally paid from the boys funds, but as the two named on this voucher did not have any money and there seems no indication of their earning any, the voucher covering their cases was submitted for approval. It does not, however, include any expenses of Mr. Canfield.

I trust that this explanation is sufficient to permit the reimbursement to Mr. Canfield for the costs incurred.
