
Sir:-

Answering your communication, Education 50218-1907, July 2nd, I have to say that I do not know of any male teacher now in the Service that would like to have the vacancy here at \$780.00 per annum. We desire for this position one who is particularly well up in mathematics, as under the departmental system which we shall carry out hereafter, we must have a good teacher in that branch. The salary is an unusual one for new teachers, and unless I can get an exceptionally good man, I prefer to promote one of our female teachers as we can do that and get along very nicely, and fill a lower grade at \$600 or \$660.

I will correspond with Miss A. Belle Reichel, Saegerstown, Pa., and if she will apparently meet the requirements, I will be glad to ask your Office for her appointment. I will advise you later as to this.

I will consider it a favor if you will aid me in the selection of a good male teacher for the \$780 position, and if you cannot satisfy yourself as to this selection, please advise me, and I will make other arrangements.
