The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D.C.

Sir:-

Referring to your letter, Education 60165/1907, in which you state that in compliance with my request, eligibles have been requested for the position of dairyman at this school, who are married, and that the appointee will be informed that his wife will be expected to cook for a detail of boys, I desire to say that I have succeeded in having Mr. Norman Egolf, who resigned from the position of dairyman June last, make application for re-instatement. Mr. Egolf is a practical dairyman and poultryman, and gave good satisfaction here. He left because of the small salary, but at my request, he has consented to assume the duties again with the understanding that I will recommend the appointment of his wife as housekeeper at \$180.00 a year in payment for her services as cook for the detail of dairy and poultry boys, usually from four to five in number. This is a very reasonable request and I am very glad to have her services in that capacity as the dairy farm and poultry yards are too far away from the general dining room to make it practicable for the boys working there to attend meals at the school; neither is it practicable for the farmer's wife to cook for the dairy and poultry boys. Mr. Egolf is ready to resume work on the morning of July 15th, and I recommend that



he be reinstated in the position of dairyman, and that the additional position of housekeeper at \$180.00 per annum be established, and that I be authorized to appoint Mrs. Norman Egolf to that position.

If the above recommendations are favorably acted upon by you, I desire to countermand my request for the appointment from the eligible list.

Mr. Egolf is used to the local conditions and has spent a lifetime in farm, dairy, and poultry business, and I would much rather have him back than take the chances of a new and untried man.
