
Sir:-

Referring to my late revised list of positions and salaries for the fiscal year 1908, I desire to say that I omitted to make a recommendation which I think should be made in justice to the employee, and which I fully intended to have made.

Mr. Karl H. Baker is a very competent printer, he has a large class of boys under him and has been doing excellent work. His salary is exceedingly small for a man of his experience and ability in his line, and I think that he should have \$1000 a year, but I told him that I would recommend this year \$900, and if at the end of the year, he made good, I would feel like recommending another increase. The efficiency of the printing department, I think, depends upon his retention, and to retain him, it is necessary to pay him a little more salary. I recommend, therefore, that I be authorized to pay

Mr. Karl H. Baker, printer, salary commencing July 1st, and for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1908, \$900 per annum.
