Answering your letter of the 13th instant, asking that the Omaha pupil from the Carlisle school, mentioned in Office letter of the 6th instant, be appointed Assistant Seamstress at the Rainy Mountain school, you are informed that another letter has just been received from Superintendent Mercer in which he says that Margaret Fremont, the pupil mentioned, is now at outing and that he does not think it best to disturb her at present. However, he has recommended Theresa Connor and says that she is willing to accept at \$300 per annum and that she can go upon receiving instructions, that if she is successful, later on she could be given the Seamstress examination and thus be entitled to promotion. The Office has therefore asked the Secretary to reduce the salary to \$300 per annum and when the authority is granted Miss Connor will be appointed and instructed to report to you for duty immediately.
