
Referring to your Office letter (Education 62249-1907) dated the 16th instant, in connection with the proposed transfer of Mr. Fred W. Canfield, Boys' outing agent, to position as day school teacher, and to the proposed promotion of Mr. Henderson to the vacancy thus created in the position of Boys' field agent, I have to inclose herewith a letter dated the 17th instant from Mr. Canfield asking for leave of absence without pay after August 1st so as to make it possible, as he states, to have Mr. Henderson take up the work.

I am not willing to approve an application by Mr. Canfield for leave without pay as to do so defers the taking of necessary steps to secure a teacher in Mr. Henderson's place which should not be much longer delayed, and it also keeps Mr. Henderson from drawing the increased salary that would result from his promotion to field agent. Mr. Henderson being on the rolls as teacher, he could not be given the pay as field agent even though Mr. Canfield should take leave without pay. To adjust matters and expedite the same, I wish your Office would, if possible, arrange for Mr. Canfield's transfer to a

position of day school teacher with as little delay as practicable. Mr. Canfield must go to New Mexico to be married and very naturally would like to know what assignment he is to have before proceeding there.

Your letter of the 19th instant with further reference to the transfer of Fred W. Canfield, Boys' Field Agent, to the position of day school teacher, and inclosing a letter from Mr. Canfield asking for leave without pay until he is transferred, is received.

At present there is no vacancy in a day school of the Southwest to which Mr. Canfield and the young lady he proposes to marry August 1 can be sent; but, as he makes application for leave without pay until he is transferred, there is no objection to your submitting his relief on July 31 and promoting Mr. James E. Henderson from teacher at \$660 per annum to Boys' Field Agent at \$900 per annum, to take effect August 1. The changes should be forwarded in the usual manner on blank form 5-241.
