FISCAL YEAR, 1908, I overlooked the promotion in one case of which I feel in error and should be rectified. George L. Gottwerth, has been performing the duties for six years; he is an Indian of good habits and decent intelligence. He is married, and two unmarried children, being a citizen of Carlisle, Pa. and occupied districts at school but is obliged to pay rent. His salary with the higher price of provisions, and the increase makes his small salary of \$420 per year too little. Therefore, to reduce cost his salary be increased, and recommend that one of the positions as fireman at \$420 a year be abolished.



Sir:-

In the many changes necessary in the salary list for the fiscal year, 1908, I overlooked the promotion in one case of which I feel is an error and should be rectified. George L. Gottwerth, fireman has been performing the duties for six years; he is an industrious man of good habits and quite intelligent. He is married, has a wife and two unmarried children, being a citizen of Carlisle, he has never occupied quarters at school but is obliged to pay rent, which together with the higher price of provisions, and the increase of all necessities, makes his small salary of \$420 per year too little, and I have, therefore, to request that his salary be increased, and recommend that one of the positions as fireman at \$420 a year be abolished, and a position at \$540 per annum be established.

As I expect to use young unmarried men, and as a rule Indians, for the other two positions, it will not be necessary to increase the salary in their cases.
