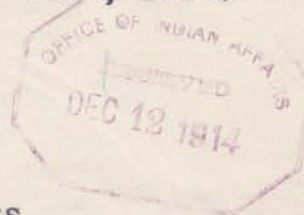

Gentlemen:

With reference to your letter of April 20, requesting certain information relative to the Carlisle School, this school was discontinued as such in 1918 when it passed under the control of the War Department. In consequence your letter was referred to this Office for reply.

A fairly complete history of the Carlisle School may be found in the Handbook of American Indians, Vol. I, (Bulletin No. 30, Bureau of Ethnology, Page 207). While this publication is now out of print you should be able to obtain a copy from your city library or from the library of the Missouri State Historical Society.

Ten photographs - five of school buildings and five illustrative of activities carried on at the Carlisle School - are being forwarded you under separate cover. These have been taken from theyOffice files of which they form a permanent part. You are therefore requested to return them as soon as they have served your purpose.
