Dear Senator:

I am in receipt of your Secretary's letter, dated February 6, transmitting therewith inquiry of Mrs. C. D. Markham, of Jefferson, Ohio, relative to the "American Indian", and asking for information upon which to base a club paper.

Mrs. Markham makes particular inquiry as to Geronimo's appeal to the President (Roosevelt). "Geronimo's Story of His Life", edited by S. M. Barrett, and published by Duffield & Company, New York, contains an appeal to be permitted to return to Arizona. This is probably the publication to which Mrs. Markham has reference.

The Carlisle School was turned over to the War Department because of war necessities, and is being used for hospital and rehabilitation purposes.

I am inclosing herewith Annual Report for the year ended June 30, 1918, also Price List of Publications of the Government Printing Office (Superintendent of Documents) and "Other Sources of Information" relative to Indians, from which Mrs. Markham may select suitable publications.
