Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of June 26, 1919, relative to the date of your enlistment in the Navy.

In this connection you are advised that the records of Carlisle Indian School show that you were on leave from December 14, 1917. The reports ending March 31, 1918 show that you were dropped January 14, to join the Navy. You were considered a member of the Carlisle Indian School until January 14.

I trust that this will correct any misunderstanding as to the date you left Carlisle Indian School.

It is suggested that you file this letter with your application for discharge, which will be evidence that you were a student in Carlisle Indian School prior to your enlistment in the Navy.


