Subject: Discontinuance of
Carlisle Indian School and
removal to Oklahoma.

August 30, 1907.

My dear Senator :

Your letter of the 28th instant has been received, in which you ask whether there is a possibility, or probability, that the Indian School at Carlisle, Pennsylvania, will be discontinued, or that there will be a recommendation to that effect, and that it will be located in Oklahoma.

A project for abandoning the Indian School at Carlisle was discussed in the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs at the last session of Congress, but action was deferred until more time could be given to the whole subject of nonreservation schools. There was no suggestion at any time, as far as I am aware, of removing the school to Oklahoma.
