Sir:

The Office has received your letter dated January 20, 1912, transmitting the report of the Board of Survey recently convened at the Carlisle School. The report is prepared in proper form.

In view of the statement of the Board of Survey that all blankets are unserviceable, authority is granted for you to dispose of them at public auction. Sufficient advertising should be had to insure competition, or an up-set price which will be fair to the Government should be placed upon the blankets before the sale.

The proceeds of this sale should be taken up after consideration of Sections 282 to 294, inclusive, Indian Office Regulations effective April 1, 1904.

A copy of this letter should be attached to the voucher on which these blankets are dropped from your property return.

You are hereby appointed a board of survey to meet at the school warehouse at 2:30 P.M. January 16, 1912, and report upon certain unserviceable property for which M. Friedman, Superintendent of the Carlisle Indian School, is responsible. You are hereby directed to determine the proper disposition to make of the property, dividing it into the following classes:

- (a) Such as can be economically repaired and put to further use.
- (b) Such as can be used in making repairs.
- (c) Such as would be of some use to Indians, if issued to them.
- (d) Such as would bring a reasonable price, if sold at public auction.
- (e) Such as is utterly worthless for any purpose and should be condemned to destruction.
