David Sawmick, being duly sworn by Inspector E. B. Linnen,
says:

I am a member of the Chippewa tribe of Indians, and my home is in Pinconning, Mich. I am 15 years of age and have been enrolled at the Carlisle Indian School since 1908.

Shortly after I came to the Carlisle Indian School, I was sent out as an outing pupil to work on a farm for a man by the name of Blackville, who lived at Titusville, N. J. I worked for this man all one summer and winter and for my services I received \$5.00 a month.

Then I went to Trenton, N. J. and worked for a farmer by the name of Joe Stell. He paid me \$7.00 a month. I worked for him about five months.

Then I went to Dolington, Pa. and worked for one Robert Balder-son. I worked for him one winter and one summer and he paid me \$5.00 a month for my services, working at his house.

Then I went to work at Falsington, Pa. for Annie Sickles, a farmer. At first they paid me \$5.00 a month for working in the house and after a while they paid me \$10.00 a month for working on the farm. I staid there one winter and two summers.

Then I came back to the Carlisle School for a short time and then they sent me out again to Trenton, N. J. where I worked for E. L. Cubberly, a farmer, for which he paid me \$12.00 a month. I worked for him until November, 1913, when I again came back to the Carlisle School, where I have been ever since.

Shortly after coming back here, I went to school a half day and worked at the greenhouse, but for about three weeks past, I have been at work in the blacksmith shop. I would like to learn that trade.

During the time I have been on the outing, at the various places mentioned, I attended public school a portion of the time, but some of the time during the school terms, the farmer would keep me out of school to work. As near as I can remember, I went to school 75 days each year at the various public schools. When I came back to the Carlisle Indian School, I was in the normal or first grade, and I am now in the second grade at said Carlisle Indian School. My five year term of school has now expired, and I am in the second grade and have worked three weeks at a trade at said school.
