In view of your taking your case into Court, there seems nothing else for this Office to do. However, it is alleged that you have been writing threatening letters to Mr. Dickey. You should be advised that the criminal laws of this country prohibit the use of the mails for such purposes, and if you persist in thus harassing a Government official, it may be necessary to invoke the authority of the law to prevent such unauthorized action.

I have your letter of the 8th inst asking for a report regarding the trouble between the field agent, D.H. Dickey and a man named Victor Passano of New Lisbon, New Jersey.

As I had no report on file of any trouble between these two men, I waited for Mr. Dickey's return to the school when I got the following information from him.

Passano is an Italian who last summer got into a fight with Themas Montoya, one of our outing boys, who at that time was working for Mr. Dickey. Because Mr. Dickey interrupted the fight and put the man off his place by force, the second time he appeared on the premises, Passano brought suit against him.

Mr. Dickey further says that this man is a trouble-maker in the neighborhood. Last spring, the constable levied on his goods tod pay his rent. He has left the neighborhood but has been writing threatening letters to Mr. Dickey and has written once to the school here trying to injure him:
