your kind and speedy reply
to my letter written to Mr Bishop of
Oct 30. of which I rec'd November
13 two days later. from your Indian
Affairs Department saying you
could not give me any criminal
one of whose bout & of said party
known by me as Acting Sergeant
Sargent W J Bishop of Roxbury
and Carlyle P O Orlanma,
as I stated in my previous letter.
and I understood he was a Secret
Service Police Officer of your Washing
ton Secret Service Police Department in
active service now. I am very much

a friend he is down to the Police
Department now for some unknown
cause of perhaps some fake arrest.
I did a little Private Detective work
myself I sent a letter down there
addressed as follows Secret Service
Officer W. J. Bishop. 18 Easton
St Lynn Mass Acting Secret
Sargent and I asked a friend of
mine if I could have the letter
returned on her name when
home because I didn't want to
come here. I sent the letter last
Monday night and put it into
the mail box 6 30 ^{pm} and
one Willie said that the letter
has not been returned to her as
yet. And I came to the conclu-
sion that if he was not confi-
ned there it would be returned
false. I told him said letter that
I had written to Carlisle Billed
ge. and explained why I did

at his place of Residence by telephone to 1533 m. and the line
was disconnected for some time I
thought by that he must have
had the telephone on his name.
And I did not hear from the Good
House Keeping Magazine. Either
I have no official pull here in
Lynn with the Department
and if I went there I might
make things worse for him if he
is down there. I am sending your
letter back to you for you to send
it back to the Dept and then
you can get him out of trouble
by your powerful Dept as
his protector belonging to the US
war Service of 1917. I know nothing
against him to cause him any trouble
for he might have sent the Cook
Book by mail and I loose out.
But I called that Good House

so and what the Colledge done was
to put in your hands Mrs Overth
and I am thourly and honestly
Exonerated from all business
and Good Housekeeping Magazine
Contracts for the balance of time going
to Colledge this last fourth term
And I would give him all money
that I loaned him when he was
down and out for a Present
for his wife was since on France
during the whole war. The letter was
sent to you Oct 30-25
Correct, but am very sorry if by
writing to the Colledge I caused him
unnecessary trouble on account of
a very few dollars, and not enough
to cause Mrs Bishop any arrest
or trouble. I have not called him
any trouble at this Police Dept
and my self. I tried to locate

Keeping Magazine Club Contract,
advised me from now on if he
is not in college this year he must
not have had any work or business to
pay all his expense. Could you find
out on your end and let me
know as soon as possible by return
mail. Please Hunt him for his
own safety sake. as I am fully
convinced on his account. Please give
the said statements to the Dept
and remove all charges against Doug
Bishop. from now on.
