Sir:

Referring to your Office letter (Education 93153/07, File 162) dated Nov. 29, 1907, in regard to filling the position of fireman at this school, I have to state that we have arranged, by the detail of capable Indian boys to perform the duties of fireman, so that for the time being at least I do not deem it necessary to have the position now vacant filled by the appointment of an eligible. I do not care to recommend any increase of salary in this position at the present time as suggested by you.

The other position of fireman at \$420 per annum is being satisfactorily filled by M. T. Dewalt, who is temporarily employed. Steps have been taken by him to qualify for appointment to such position, and if he makes an eligible percentage it is hoped that it may be arranged, in accordance with the Civil Service rules, to have him permanently appointed.

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

The Commission has the honor to inclose herewith *5* copies of its newspaper announcement, No. *45*, of a special open competitive examination to be held on *January*, 1908, for the grade of *Teacher of Mechanical Drawing.*

This announcement will be published as widely as possible, and especially in the newspapers circulated in the locality in which the vacancy exists. In the interest of the service, full competition in this examination is desired, and your Department is requested to aid as much as practicable in this respect by distributing the inclosed copies, and in any other available manner. Additional copies of the announcement for distribution will be mailed on request.

If a temporary appointment has been or will be made, it is requested that the Department direct the temporary appointee to enter the examination.

The attention of the Department is invited to Transfer Regulation VIII, which reads as follows:

REGULATION VIII.

When a requisition has been made under section 1 of Rule VII for a certification of eligibles, and the Commission, at the request of the Department, has made public announcement of a special examination to secure such eligibles, the vacancy shall not thereafter be filled by transfer, promotion, or reinstatement, without the consent of the Commission.

TEACHER OF MECHANICAL DRAWING.

INDIAN SERVICE.

JANUARY 22, 1908.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces an examination on January 22, 1908, at the places mentioned in the list printed hereon, to secure eligibles from which to make certification to fill a vacancy in the position of teacher of mechanical drawing (male or female), at \$600 per annum, Carlisle School, Pa., and vacancies requiring similar qualifications as they may occur in the Indian Service.

The examination will consist of the subjects mentioned below, weighted as indicated:

Subjects.	Weights.
1. Arithmetic and computations (including decimals and simple mechanical computations)	10
2. Drawing and shading (including a finished mechanical drawing made from rough sketch and showing shade and section lines).....	40
3. Drawings and specifications (including the making from sketch and description of a finished drawing for photolithographic reproduction).....	50
Total.....	100

Applicants should bring with them to the examination room the necessary drawing instruments, scale, ink, and a drawing board at least 15 inches square.

Age limit, 20 years or over on the date of the examination.

This examination is open to all citizens of the United States who comply with the requirements.

This announcement contains all information which is communicated to applicants regarding the scope of the examination, the vacancy or vacancies to be filled, and the qualifications required.

Applicants should at once apply either to the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., or to the secretary of the board of examiners at any place mentioned in the list printed hereon, for application Form 304. No application will be accepted unless properly executed and filed with the Commission at Washington. In applying for this examination the exact title as given at the head of this announcement should be used in the application.

As examination papers are shipped direct from the Commission to the places of examination, it is necessary that applications be received in ample time to arrange for the examination desired at the place indicated by the applicant. The Commission will therefore arrange to examine any applicant whose application is received in time to permit the shipment of the necessary papers.
