Dear Sir:-

Your letter of the 17th instant to the President, suggesting the name of your father, Geo. Bridges, for Superintendent of the Carlisle School, has been referred to the Indian Office for answer.

The position of Superintendent of an Indian School is in the classified Civil Service, and as it does not appear that your father is in that Civil Service, he can not be considered for this appointment. As this is the largest Indian School in the Service, the Superintendent must necessarily have had wide experience in the management of such institutions.
