Sir:

The Civil Service Commission held an examination to obtain eligibles for the position of teacher of mechanical drawing at \$600 per annum in the Carlisle School, and has just certified two names composing the register. When Supervisor Dickson was in charge he was asked whether the position should be filled, and his statement was that it was hardly advisable to fill the position for the remainder of the year, but that it should be provided for next year. The Office must take some action on the certificate issued by the Commission, and desires to have your recommendation as to making an appointment now or waiting until sometime during the vacation months of July and August, and instructing the appointee to report for duty when the school actively reopens in September.

Sir:-

In answer to Office letter marked "Education Cer. 6483, WAM", dated May 9, 1908, relative to filling the position of teacher of mechanical drawing, I respectfully request that the position be filled from the list of eligibles now.


Ordinarily, there would be no reason for getting a man in that position at present because it is nearing the end of the school year, but as practically no organizing has been done in this department, and a large amount of work will be necessary before active teaching can be begun in September, it is necessary for the instructor to be here at this time. Aside from the organization and mapping out of his course, quite an amount of actual drafting for the other shops and for building improvements will have to be done.

Because of the practical nature of this work, and for the reason that instruction in mechanical drawing will be directly applied to the various trades, a man is needed who not only has ability as a teacher, but as a draftsman as well.

In the Report of Salaries for the next fiscal year, I made

a recommendation that the salary of mechanical drawing teacher be increased from \$600 to \$840 beginning July 1st. If a man can be appointed at present, I respectfully request that no increase be made until after the probation period of the employee, and upon further recommendation from this office. If the employee proves efficient, and his services are of greater value to the Government, his salary can be raised gradually.
