Dear Madam:

Your letter of the 20th instant, saying you have heard that the position of matron of the dining room at the Carlisle Indian School is to be vacant, and that you know of a good woman who would be capable for the position, is received.

In answer you are informed that the position of matron in the Indian Service is classified and unless the applicant you have in mind has passed the examination and her name stands well up on the register, there would not be very much hope of her receiving an appointment. If she has not taken the examination, it is suggested that she apply to the Civil Service Commission, and in event that she should pass with a good percentage and her name should be certified to the Office her appointment to some suitable vacancy will be given consideration.

The Office is not informed that there is now a vacancy at Carlisle.
