the nomination of Miss Elsa A. Mayham to the position of matron at
\$600 per annum has been forwarded today.

Cherokee, N.C., to the other position of assistant matron at \$600
at this school, as stated in your letter (Education 68558-07) of
August 24th, fills all the vacancies of assistant matron at this
