



Sir:

Miss Sarah E. Gedney, teacher at this school at \$600.00 per annum, who, as your Office is aware, has been for sometime trying to effect a transfer to a clerical position in the departmental service at Washington, now has official notice from the Bureau of Forestry, Agricultural Department, that the Civil Service Commission has approved her transfer and that her appointment will be requested as a clerk in the forestry service.

Miss Gedney has signified her willingness to remain at Carlisle in the capacity of teacher, if necessary, until November 1st, and it is thought that this will be agreeable to the Forestry Service at Washington. It is presumed the request for the transfer will be made through your Office in due time, but in order that no delay may occur in securing a successor to fill Miss Gedney's place, I write to you now and have to request that steps be taken to secure another woman teacher, unmarried, either by transfer or by appointment from the Civil Service register of eligibles--the person so appointed to report for duty as soon as practicable, in no event later than November 1st.
