Sir:

There is transmitted herewith the resignation of William H. H. Austin, assistant carpenter at this school at \$720 per annum, such resignation to take effect on December 24, 1907. I have to recommend that the resignation be accepted as tendered.

Just at this time there is no urgent need for an assistant carpenter in this position and as there is need, in view of the high prices for supplies of all kinds for the school for the present year, to exercise economy in order to make the appropriation for the fiscal year meet the requirements, I have to request that no action be taken to fill the place at this time.

Mr. Austin entered upon duty here on Oct. 17, 1907, and as his probationary period has not expired he requests that his name be reinstated upon the Civil Service list of eligibles without prejudice to him.
