Sir:-

Referring to your letter Education 98187/07, File 163, dated November 25, 1907, in relation to the mutual transfer of nurses at Carlisle and Haskell, I have to say that a copy of said letter was furnished the nurse at Carlisle, and that I am informed officially by the school physician that the nurse at Haskell has changed her mind about the transfer, and does not wish to effect it.

As I understand the situation, the matter of transfer has been all arranged and simply left for the nurses themselves to select the date. Inasmuch as they do not see fit to do so, I recommend that your Office order the transfers made, as I believe it to be for the best interest of the Service to have the transfers, as arranged for, carried out.

As the application for the transfer came from Mr. Peairs at Haskell, and has the endorsement and recommendation of Superintendent Peairs, it is presumed that he feels as I do on this subject, and that it will be to the advantage of both schools to effect the transfer.

Sir:

Referring to the proposed exchange in positions between Miss Guest, your nurse, and Miss Ross, nurse at Carlisle, you are informed that a letter has been received from Superintendent Mercer in which he says that he has been informed by the school physician that your nurse has changed her mind and does not wish to effect the transfer. Superintendent Mercer recommends that the exchange be directed, as he believes it will be for the best interests of the Service; and as the application originally came from your school, and had your endorsement, he presumes you feel the same way on the subject. The Office understands from your letter that you wish Miss Guest transferred, and that you are willing to give the nurse at Carlisle a trial. You are therefore authorized to direct Miss Guest to report to Superintendent Mercer on Dec. 20. Superintendent Mercer has been authorized to instruct Miss Ross to report to you on the same date.
