I respectfully request that the positions of housekeeper at \$180.00 per annum, occupied by Annie R. Granford and Elizabeth Egolf, be abolished. There are very few boys who are getting their food at the first farm at present. As you know, we have two farms, and both of these housekeepers are employed at the first farm which is but a short distance away from the school. At the second farm, which is much farther away from the school campus no housekeeper is employed, and no inconvenience is experienced. The mere fact that boys eat at the first farm causes a great deal of loafing around the barns there. It is but a short walk to the first farm, and it will not be any hardship on the boys if they get their meals in the students' dining room, and sleep in the students' quarters.

I respectfully request that these positions be ab olished for the reasons that they are not necessary and economy of administration will result.
