Your letter of the 12th Instant, with reference to the transfer of Arthur E. Schaal, your clerk at \$1,000 per annum, to Chilocco at \$1,200 per annum, and that of Harvey K. Meyer, from clerk at Haskell Institute to Carlisle, vice Mr. Schaal, is received.

Supt. Wise of Chilococ recommended the establishment of an additional position of clerk at \$1,200 per annum for his school, and that Mr. Schaal be transferred to the place. As there was already a chief clerk at \$1,200 per annum authorized for the Chilococ School, the Superintendent was informed that the Office had no objection to giving him a clerk at \$1,000 per annum, nor to the transfer of Mr. Schaal to the new place, provided he wished it and you approved. No word has been received since then from Supt. Wise, and the Office does not know whether Mr. Schaal will accept the \$1,000 per annum. I have a communication from Superintendent Wise of Chilocco, dated June 3,1908, in which he states that he has requested the transfer of Mr. Arthur E. Schaal, clerk at this school, to the position of chief clerk at Chilocco, the change in salary to be from \$1000 to \$1200 per annum.

I replied to Mr. Wise under date of June 6th, stating that I had no objections whatever to the transfer of Mr. Schaal, but that I did not desire such a transfer to be effective until I could obtain some one in the latter's place.
