Sir:

There is inclosed herewith correspondence relating to the proposed transfer of Mr. Norman H. Justus, farmer at this school at \$720 per annum, to a similar position at the Rapid City Indian school, South Dakota, and the transfer of Mr. C. W. Cranford, now farmer at said school at \$800 per annum, to the position of farmer here. I believe the proposed exchange would be for the good of the service and respectfully recommend that the matter be arranged so that the change can be effected to take place on February 1st as proposed.

It will be noted that Mr. and Mrs. Justus desire permission to stop over a few days at their home at Toledo, Iowa, and it is recommended that the desired permission be granted in accordance with the rules governing leave of absence.

Sir:-

The Office is in receipt of your letter of the 13th instant, with reference to the proposed exchange in positions between Norman H. Justus, your Farmer at \$720 per annum, and C. W. Cranford, Farmer at \$800 per annum in the Rapid City School.

As this seems to be by mutual consent of all parties concerned, there is no objection to it taking effect, and you are authorized to correspond with Superintendent House and have the exchange take effect on February 1. As Mr. Justus wishes to stop over a few days at his home in Toledo, Iowa, you are authorized to grant him leave of absence with pay for the time desired, to be charged against his regular thirty days' annual leave. The time taken should be reported on the usual blank for the information of the Indian Office.
