Sir:

Referring to Office letter of Jan. 23, 1909, marked "Accounts 4921/09" advising that up to Dec. 31, 1908, the amount of \$12,194.17 was remitted to various agents and superintendents in the field for use in transporting pupils to this school as per itemized schedule rendered, I have the honor to request further consideration of same.

Office letter of May 1st., marked "Accounts 30975/09" enumerates the sum of \$5,291.56 granted under authority for transportation of pupils from various agencies and schools, as per itemized list.

On Jan. 27th. I requested that the unexpended balances of the amounts remitted be recalled and redeposited in order that I may estimate for it on future requisitions, advising that inasmuch as we had more than the usual quota of pupils, no more would be admitted until the fall term, or after the close of the present fiscal year.

Indian Office letter of Feb. 3, 1909, marked "Accounts 7770/09" advised that the various Superintendents whose statements of public funds show that they have on hand money under the appropriation, "Indian School, Carlisle, Pa., 1909", were requested to deposit their balance which aggregate \$3,560.87, in addition to which the Superintendent at Fort Lapawi, Idaho, had already deposited

\$881.85 of the \$1,000 which was remitted to him.

Office letter of April 22nd, marked "Accounts 29,529,1909" advised that the amounts remitted to various Superintendents and Agents for transportation of pupils to this School aggregated the net sum of \$6,342.65, and advised that it was barely possible that a small part of this may be returned to the Treasurer as requested in my letter of Jan. 27th. In view of the fact, that we shall not require any more pupils during the current fiscal year, from various Agencies and Schools to which points these funds have been remitted for transporting pupils to this School, I have the honor to request that all un-expended balances on hand with various Agents and Superintendents, under the appropriation "Indian School, Carlisle, Pa. 1909," be re-deposited in order that the same be available at this School before the close of the present fiscal year, and I respectfully request a final statement of this amount in order to have the accurate account of the same.

In reply to your letter of the 15th instant requesting data as to the condition of your support fund for the fiscal year 1909, you are advised that to December 31, 1908, there was remitted to various agents and superintendents for use in transporting pupils to your school the net amount of \$12,194.17, as per itemized schedule which is herewith enclosed.

In addition to this amount, there has been withdrawn from the Treasury \$103,558.62, this amount representing remittances to you and claims for miscellaneous supplies which have been settled by the Treasury Department. This, as you will see, left an actual balance of \$48,267.21 in the Treasury on December 31, 1908.

For your information however, it should be stated that to date this appropriation is hypothecated to the extent of \$150,899.23. This, of course, includes \$64,522.77, which was set aside for the payment of Annual Estimate claims,
