I have to respectfully advise that the following amounts applicable to appropriation, "Indian School, Carlisle, Pa., 1913," including repairs and improvements, have been received by deposits with the Treasurer United States, subject to my official check as Superintendent and Special Disbursing Agent of this school, were received under dates noted, namely:

Invoices have been received covering supplies delivered to this school by the various Indian warehouses, including \$18,907.53, which are chargeable to "Indian School, Carlisle, Pa., 1913," including Repairs and Improvements, and "Indian Moneys, Proceeds of Labor, Carlisle School," making a total of \$148,657.82.

In this connection, I have to respectfully state that inasmuch as most of the supplies for the current year have been delivered, it is desired to have a statement of the warehouse invoices which have been paid from your Office. This is necessary in order to ascertain the balance of the various funds appropriated by Congress for expenditure under my supervision as Superintendent and Special Disbursing Officer at this school, and in order that I may utilize all the funds available for various purposes necessarily required, and avoid returning a large amount to the Treasury.

The requests which have lately been submitted to your Office payable from "Indian School, Carlisle, Pa., 1913," have been returned approved payable from "Indian Moneys, Proceeds of Labor." An explanation for the reason of this change is respectfully requested.
