Sir:

From your letter of May 5 it is apparent that you have interpreted Office letter of May 3 to mean that obligations are already outstanding against "Indian Moneys, Proceeds of Labor (Carlisle)", to an amount greater than that available. The statement contained in that letter had reference only to the condition of this fund as shown by the ledger account of appropriations in this Office, and not to its condition as shown by the liability account.

The overdraft referred to is in the negligible amount of \$2.70, and will be wiped out at the time the funds deposited by you on April 26 are returned.

Inasmuch as there is still an unhypothecated balance of \$3237.37 in this fund it does not appear necessary that you be furnished with a statement of the obligations against the same.
