To The Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,
Washington.

Sir:

The enclosed letter of Clifford Taylor a Carlisle student which was forwarded to this office Oct. 17th for report and return not later than Nov. 1st was inadvertently laid aside and neglected. With reference to the matter, I have to say that this boy's statement that he is over 21 years of age is correct. I do not, however, see the necessity of turning these funds over to him during the time that he is in school. They are now drawing $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ interest compounded semi-annually which I understand is a higher rate of interest than is paid upon the students' funds on deposit with the Carlisle school. This is my only objection for not turning over these funds at this time. As soon as the boy has completed his course in school and received his industrial certificate, I shall be glad to turn over every dollar of his money to him.
