Sir:

In further response to your letter of October 8, 1910, concerning your lease money, you are advised that your funds are now drawing  $4\frac{1}{2}$  percent interest compounded semi-annually, which is a greater rate of interest than that paid on funds of students on deposit with the Carlisle School. The Office does not see its way clear to turn the funds over to you without restrictions at the present time.

To The Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,  
Washington.

Sir:

The enclosed letter of Clifford Taylor a Carlisle student which was forwarded to this office Oct. 17th for report and return not later than Nov. 1st was inadvertently laid aside and neglected. With reference to the matter, I have to say that this boy's statement that he is over 21 years of age is correct. I do not, however, see the necessity of turning these funds over to him during the time that he is in school. They are now drawing  $4\frac{1}{2}\%$  interest compounded semi-annually which I understand is a higher rate of interest than is paid upon the students' funds on deposit with the Carlisle school. This is my only objection ~~for~~ <sup>to</sup> not turning over these funds at this time. As soon as the boy has completed his course in school and received his industrial certificate, I shall be glad to turn over every dollar of his money to him.

Dear Sir;

I am writing you this letter for the reason that I wish arrangements be made by the authorities to have my lease money a balance of about (\$372<sup>00</sup>). that I have deposited at the several banks nearby Pawnee, Okla. in care of the Agent Geo. W. Nellis, be forwarded to me here at Carlisle, to be placed in the bank in care of this school.

As I shall find myself in need of it. The said money is the lease brought from my allotment, and was deposited in the bank in care of the agent as I was at the time under age, therefore I could not draw it. The birth records kept at the Pawnee Agency shows that I was born on the 26<sup>th</sup> of Aug. 1887 thus making me twenty three (23 years old) which entitles me to my lease payments.

At our Agency we are entitled to our  
lease payments when we attain the  
age of Twenty one (21 years) therefore  
it is for this reason that I ask to have  
the money forwarded to me and I  
trust that you will deal justly with <sup>my</sup>  
in this matter as I have two years of  
enrollment here at this school.

My term of enrollment expired this  
past summer but as I am a member  
of the present Junior Class I felt it  
my duty to return and spend a couple  
more years, in which time I expect  
to graduate with the Class of '1913.'

I realize what the outing system  
of Carlisle affords to us students, to  
work out during the vacation months  
this is suitable to those who are not  
members of the upper four class,  
as they have at least five months  
of outing while the four advanced  
grade have only two months.

I am also connected with the  
basket-ball and track athletics and  
I really have to make up my studies  
during my vacation periods

and I have a great interest in my trade  
that I don't care to leave it. I have been  
working at the tailoring trade since  
enrolling here the year 1905. and am  
doing good work. Before closing may  
I hope to hear from you in regard to  
what could be done for me. I hardly  
think I can be able to work out during  
the vacation. and I shall depend upon  
it to purchase clothing. & So. I close.
