Before making this request I would like to be advised of the correct amount with you and whether it could be transferred to me, placed to her credit here and included in closing out her account.

The appointment of an administrator involves so much expence that monies deposited under the rules governing individual Indian monies are transferred from one disbursing officer to another or to the legal heir by the Superintendent signing the check for a deserter or a deceased pupil when so authorized by the Office.
