

I therefore most earnestly recommend that the usual supervision be continued either thru this office or thru the office of Superintendent Johnson of the Sac and Fox Agency.

I do not know the young man whom she is to marry, but it is my opinion that he should be expected to provide the funds with which to begin housekeeping and to prove his ability to care for his wife before assuming the responsibility of assisting her in the proper handling of her own funds and her own property.

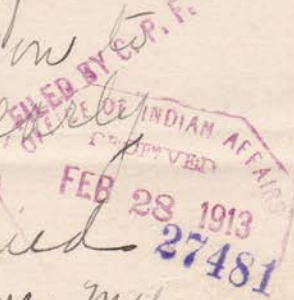
