I have your letter of October 24, 1913, urging payment to you of the sum of \$129.54 remaining to your credit as individual Indian money when you left the Carlisle School, Pennsylvania, and note your statement that you have not yet received the money from Carlisle, notwithstanding the fact that authority was granted the Superintendent on August 30, to pay the money over to you.

The records here show that authority was granted the Superintendent at Carlisle to pay you the money, but later correspondence discloses the fact that the Superintendent sent this money to Mr. Nicholson, the Superintendent at Keshena, and authority was accordingly granted Mr. Nicholson on October 13, to approve your checks for \$100 for the purchase of a house and improvements on a claim, and \$29.54 for clothes, dental work, and miscellaneous expenses.



I kindly ask you to investigate about the matter and notify me what the trouble is that I can not get it. I have a pretty good education and I can handle my money as good as any white man. I have no home and I want to buy some lumber so that I can have a home

Carlisle Indian School, part of this money
is my annuity that was forwarded to
Mr Friedman Supt of the Carlisle School.
The total amount of which is One -
hundred and twenty nine & 54/100 of dollars
(\$129⁵⁴) Last June my term of five
years expired and ^{before} Mr Friedman
sent the money to Supt. A. S. Nicholson
at this Agency, I am 23 years of age
^{and} when I demanded my money at
the office Mr. H. P. Marble, Asst Supt
made me sign the check than refused
to give me my money.
I am sure that I am ~~old~~ of age, and

Further more I have not committed any crime, did not break any rules and regulations governing us Indians I am of sound mind I think that I am capable of making good use of my hard earned money part of which is my annuity.

I also asked my father Joseph Waupoose to intercede for me, but meet with the same results was refused.

Again I ask that you please help me in granting my request.

Hoping that this urgent matter may receive an early and favorable consideration.

If necessary I will willingly make a sworn affidavit as to fully statement being true.

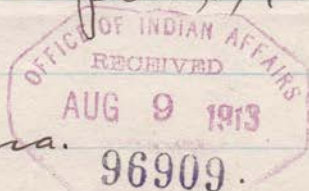
