I respectfully submit herewith correspondence that has passed between this office and Superintendent McFatrige of the Blackfeet Agency at Browning, Montana, regarding several amounts that are due and remain unpaid in connection with transportation that was furnished to James Bearchild during the time he was connected with this school as a student.

The check for an amount of thirty-eight cents is to reimburse Mr. Henderson, now employed at the Cherokee Agency in North Carolina, for expenses incurred in going to Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, to bring James to Carlisle, after notification had been received that he was in trouble there.

For the reason that James cannot be located it is respectfully requested that I be authorized to sign the checks and to settle the accounts.
